

# Lafayette PTA Enrichment Program

## Spring 2018 Registration Form

- Spring Session begins Monday, April 2<sup>nd</sup> and ends Friday, June 15<sup>th</sup>, unless otherwise noted. Session is approximately 10 weeks long. A few classes will go for nine weeks due to holidays, etc. Cost for those classes remains at rate noted.
- Registrations are due by Wednesday, March 28<sup>th</sup>.
- Classes with a stated maximum limit will be determined by lottery. Late registrations will be considered by PTA Enrichment coordinator.
- Two ways to register: On line (processed in real time) OR paper enrollment (processed at same time as on line). If enrolling by paper, please fill out and hand in last two pages of this document to the PTA Command Center's Drop Slot. Parents will receive an email confirmation prior to the start of the session.
- Full and Partial Scholarships are available to families who request them, no questions asked, for one class per child per session with maximum total scholarship of \$200. Please note that scholarships are funded through the proceeds of the PTA Enrichment Program itself, i.e. from all our families. Our goal is to be all-inclusive but also self-sustaining. Please carefully consider the needs of your family when deciding whether to request a scholarship. Scholarship requests will be kept confidential. If the demand for scholarships is too great, the PTA may need to limit the number of scholarships awarded.

## Rules of Participation

- For all afternoon classes, children will be accounted for in the class by taking attendance. Students must be picked up promptly when class ends. If there is a problem with pickup, please be in contact with the teacher by phone or arrange to have another parent to pick up your child. Parents that are chronically late may be unable to continue participating in the current session and may be unable to register for classes in the future.
- If your child will miss class, please let the instructor know in advance by email, phone or text.
- Students are expected to be respectful and act appropriately during Enrichment Programs. Failure to do so may result in inability for student to continue in the Enrichment Program. Instructors will determine if a student should continue if behavior is disruptive or inhibits others' experience.
- Classes with maximum class sizes will be selected by lottery. The exception to this will be the teacher's or parent coordinator's own children. All efforts will be made to create space for all children.
- A Class may be completely cancelled if the minimum number of students is not reached.
- Classes/Clubs are chosen for the needs of community. New classes and clubs are always sought and can apply to the Enrichment Program for review.
- Cancellation Policy: If you cancel registration 48 hours before the session begins, you may receive a full refund. If you cancel within the 48 hours, or during the session, we won't guarantee a refund.
